CHAD's vision is to be the national model on how to improve lives and communities by providing and maintaining affordable housing for every low-to moderate-income individual or family that needs it.

Dear Friends of CHAD,

As the President and CEO of CHAD, it's my distinct pleasure to reflect on the past several years and confidently announce that we have entered into a new era of growth. In fact, 2016 will mark CHAD's largest ever single-year growth of affordable housing via acquisition and development.

By restructuring our debt through refinancing, selling an underperforming asset, and receiving support through sponsors and federal housing grants, CHAD is now in a financial position to significantly expand our housing portfolio. We recently acquired 30 new units within the City of Naperville and plans are underway to acquire upwards of 100 additional units this year and next.

In prior years, CHAD's focus had been on rehabilitating its existing portfolio of approximately 400 housing units to make all necessary life-safety upgrades and ensure the highest levels of quality. This has now been accomplished, enabling us to pursue exciting expansion plans.

I particularly want to mention several agencies, organizations and corporations that have been instrumental in our many successes. They include: The DuPage County Community Development Commission, from whom we received federal housing grant funding; The City of Naperville, from whom we received housing grant funds; the Glen Ellyn Infant Welfare Society for its continued generous support of our mission; FirstMerit Bank for partnering with us on a portfolio-wide refinance; West Suburban Bank and Wintrust Bank for their continued underwriting support; and finally, the Enterprise Corp. for its award of a Capital Needs Assessment Grant to better preserve the future quality of CHAD housing.

We're honored by the support we've received and thrilled that it has enabled us to better meet the affordable housing needs of the individuals and families we serve. At the end of the day, providing people with safe, aesthetically pleasing and affordable housing is the heart and soul of what we do. And as this report reflects, it's the personal relationships CHAD forges that is our greatest reward.

While CHAD is hard at work to exponentially grow the number of its affordable housing units, the number of individuals and families critically in need of that housing continues to grow. With that perspective, I wish to thank you for your past support and ask for your continued support so that CHAD can continue to make the western suburbs home to grateful families and healthy communities.

GEORGE AND RHONDA: *Room to Grow (Revisited)*

Both George and his wife, Rhonda, served in the Army in their young adult lives. George was in the Special Services Division during the Vietnam War and then worked for UPS and RR Donnelly. Due to a corporate downsizing and the subsequent loss of income, they endured financial hardships that eventually led to the loss of their home.

They found themselves living in a tiny, cramped one-bedroom apartment with their two children and a third child on the way. George and Rhonda knew they needed to find a larger home. Thanks to CHAD they were able to find a more spacious home when they needed it most and the family moved into a ranch-style home in 2004.

Since then George and Rhonda have had three more children. "With a family of eight, we could have ended up living in different places. Who knows what could have happened to us," said George, who is now retired. "This house has given us complete stability."

George also compliments the CHAD staff for going above and beyond in establishing a meaningful and personal relationship. "It's more like a family than a landlord-tenant relationship. That's how it should be, because at some points during our relationship, we needed to come together to get things done."





That kind of creativity is not always possible when a family is under stress. Having a stable home life gives all of them the freedom to dream big.

A recent widow, mother of two young children and pregnant with twins, Iris came to the United States from Guatemala hoping for a much better life. While living with her sister, she began searching for housing options for her family. She participated in a two-year housing and mentoring program, during which she was always looking, hoping and working for something better and permanent.

Through a friend she learned about CHAD, applied for housing and was accepted. CHAD was able to place Iris and her four children in a four-bedroom townhouse in Wood Dale.

That was 10 years ago and Iris has never looked back. She has a job, has remarried and her children have grown and thrived in the local public schools. In an effort to give back, Iris gave up her housing voucher in 2011. "For me, that was a big step," she said. "I had it for nine and a half years. But we consider it an honor to work and to provide for our kids. It is sometimes hard, but there are other people who need it more than we do. We feel very rich and happy."






